Purpose


- Launched in 2011 to provide an <u>international</u>

- Independent Reporting Mechanism
 - OGP hires an external auditor to assess the process for crafting the plan and validating whether government achieved its commitments

Highlights of the PH Self-Assessment Report

ACTION PLAN DEVELOPMENT

- Development of the plan was government-led;
 participation of business sector and civil society needs to be improved
- PHL-OGP Steering Committee was created as output of the multi-stakeholder consultations

IMPLEMENTATION of 19 OGP Commitments

- Fulfilled Commitments: 7
- Partially-fulfilled Commitments: 9
- Commitments In Progress: 3



OGP IRM Recommendations

I. Strategically draft commitments

 Clarify how commitments coherently promote OGP values and how they relate to the "eligibility criteria" for membership in the OGP. Identify and remove overlapping commitments

2. Clarify construction of the Plan

 Identify project milestones with clear indicators and metrics to allow tracking. Make future commitments more manageable (limit number of commitments). Conduct public consultation meetings with CSOs and stakeholders on the development of the plan and document discussions

3. Focus content

• Focus on freedom of information. Consider using mobile technology for monitoring. Ensure analysis, usefulness, and usability of data through open formats and improved data validation processes

Freedom of Information Act and Whistleblowers' Protection Act

OVERALL TARGET

The government commits to include in the priority legislation of the Executive two bills that promote access to information and protection of whistleblowers

KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Freedom of Information Act and Whistleblowers' Protection Act are now both included in the Priority Measures of the President for the 16th Congress which was submitted to the legislature last July 30, 2014



Citizens Participatory Audit



OVERALL TARGET

COA will create an internal unit as a mode to institutionalize the engagement of CSOs in conducting participatory audits of government projects

- A Project Management Office (PMO) under the Office of the COA Chairperson was created (COA Resolution No. 2014 – 002)
- 3 participatory audits conducted

Seal of Good Local Governance (SGLG)

OVERALL TARGET

DILG through the SGLG will enhance the existing performance review of LGUs and expand benchmarks beyond financial practices

- SGLG launched last Jan 2014 to upgrade and replace the Seal of Good Housekeeping
- SGLG indicators developed
- Implementing guidelines issued (JMC No. 2014-39)
- 1,646 LGUs assessed for SGLG



PhilGEPS Modernization



OVERALL TARGET

The current government electronic procurement system will be enhanced to include additional functionalities by 2015, such as facilities for uploading of bid document, electronic payment, and uploading of APPs

- On-going system requirement study
- Development of the modernized PhilGEPS system – Phase I (Base system)

Grassroots Participatory Budgeting

OVERALL TARGET

By 2014, 90% of all local government units have engaged grassroots organizations in the local planning and budgeting process, and their identified priority projects are funded in the national budget

- All LGUs have engaged grassroots organizations in the local planning and budgeting process
- 99% of LGUs with LPRAPs
 for 2015 budget preparation



Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative (EITI)

OVERALL TARGET KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS A report disclosing

A report disclosing the revenues of extractive industries and government revenues from these industries will be published by December 2014

2 scoping studies completed, 2 are on-going (prep work for the 1st EITI report)



Gameplan for Competitiveness-Ease of Doing Business



OVERALL TARGET

By 2014, key indicators for ease of doing business would have improved. By 2016, the target is to bring the Philippines from the bottom-third rankings in the Doing Business Report to the topthird rank

- PH jumped to **I 08**th **place** from the previous year's 138th rank in the Doing Business Global Survey 2014
- Submitted 2015 Reform Inventory to IFC

Open Data Philippines



OVERALL TARGET

An open portal will be launched and feature 350 datasets, and 70 dashboards and visualizations on selected government data presented in a more understandable and open format

- Open Data Philippines portal launched in January 2014
- 750 datasets published; I I dashboards and visualizations created


