THE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 12009 THE NEW GOVERNMENT PROCUREMENT ACT

Transitory Period

Prior to the effectivity of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act No. 12009, the provision of **Republic Act No. 9184 and its IRR shall remain in force** and effect in order to ensure the continued implementation of programs, activities, and projects.

The GPPB and all HoPE, Procuring Entities and the BACs, affected by this Act shall be given a **three (3)-year transitory period from the approval of the standard forms** for procurement to fully comply with the requirements of this Act.

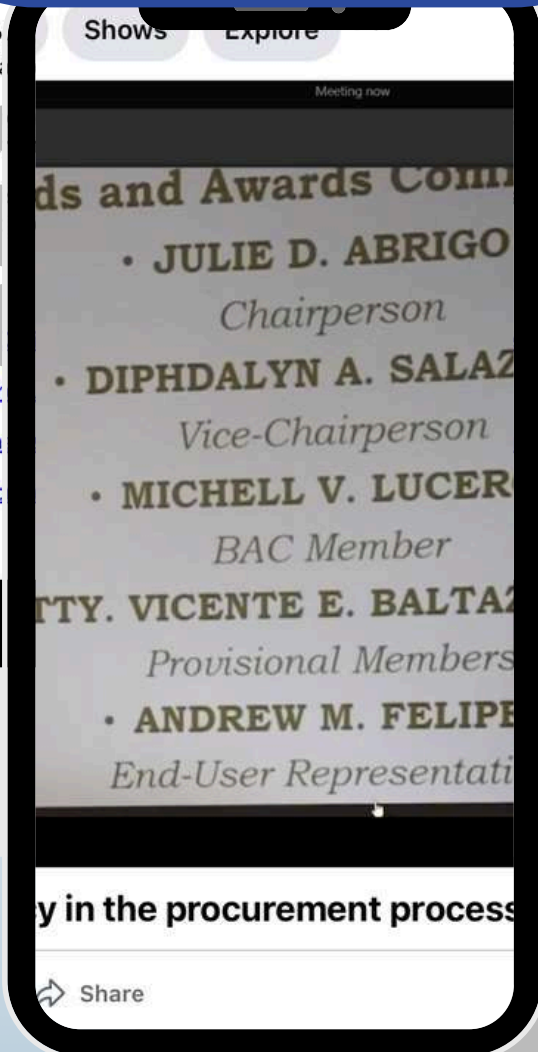

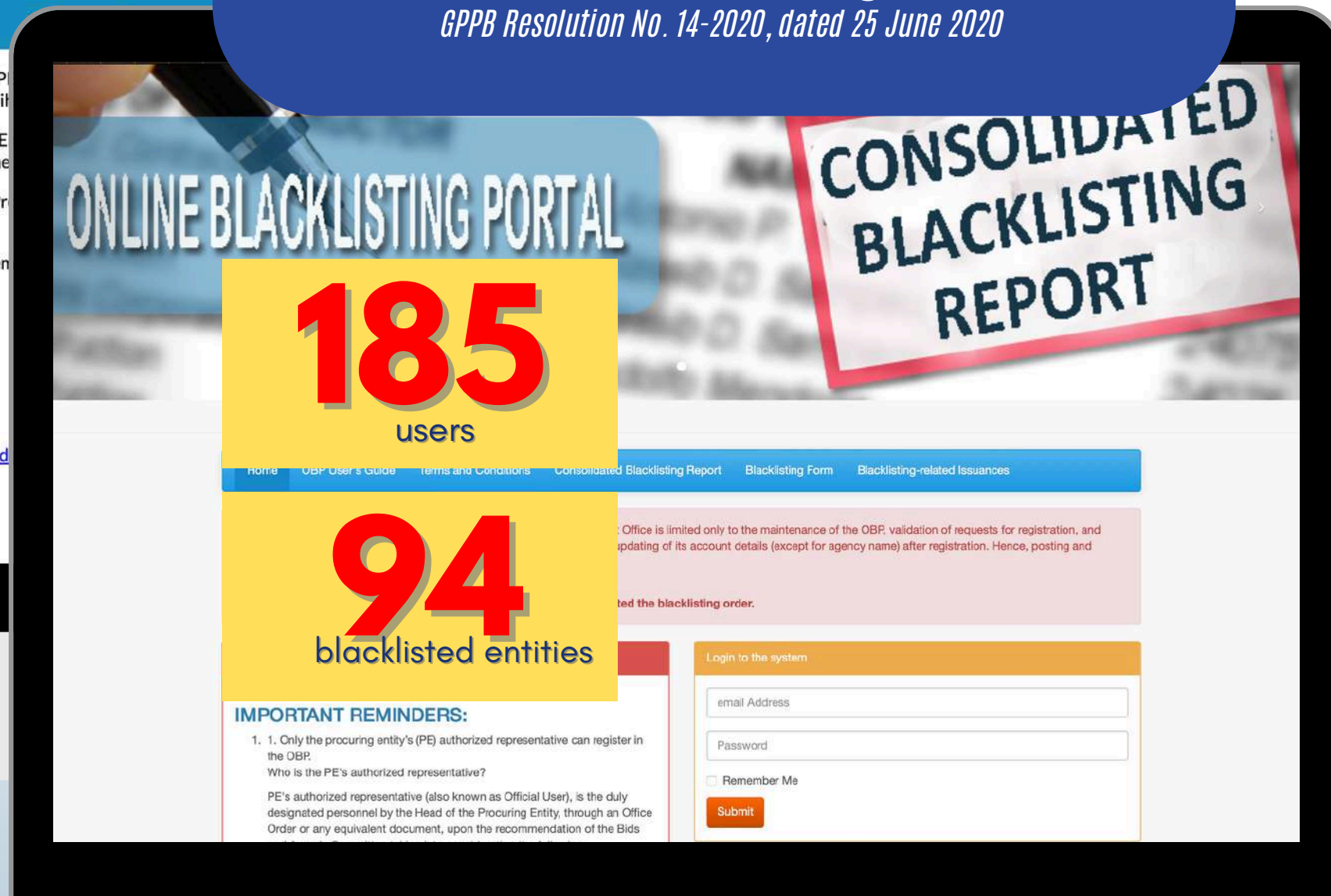

Sec. 38, RA No. 12009

1. All procurement-related conferences for Competitive Bidding, which includes pre-procurement conference, pre-bid conference, bid opening, and other meetings of the BAC.
2. Livestream the preliminary examination and the opening of the bids to the public on the PE website, social media account, or any other form of livestreaming services.
3. Threshold: Above Ten million pesos (Goods), above Twenty million pesos (Infrastructure Projects), and above (Consulting Services)



Beneficial Ownership Declaration

Sec. 82, RA No. 12009

xx The beneficial ownership information of the suppliers, manufacturers, distributors, contractors, or consultants shall be **a requirement to participate in government procurement.** xx



Beneficial Ownership



Beneficial ownership refers to the **person or group who ultimately benefits** from or controls a company involved in a government contract, even if they are not the official owner listed on paper.



Role of Observer

Sec. 13, RA No. 9184

xx at least two(2) observers to sit in its proceedings, one(1) from a duly recognized private group in a sector or discipline relevant to the procurement at hand, and the **other from a non-government organization** xx

Sec. 43, RA No. 12009

xx at least two (2) observers to sit in its proceedings: one (1) from a duly recognized private group in a sector or discipline relevant to the procurement at hand, and the **other from a civil society organization (CSO) or people's organization (PO)**. xx



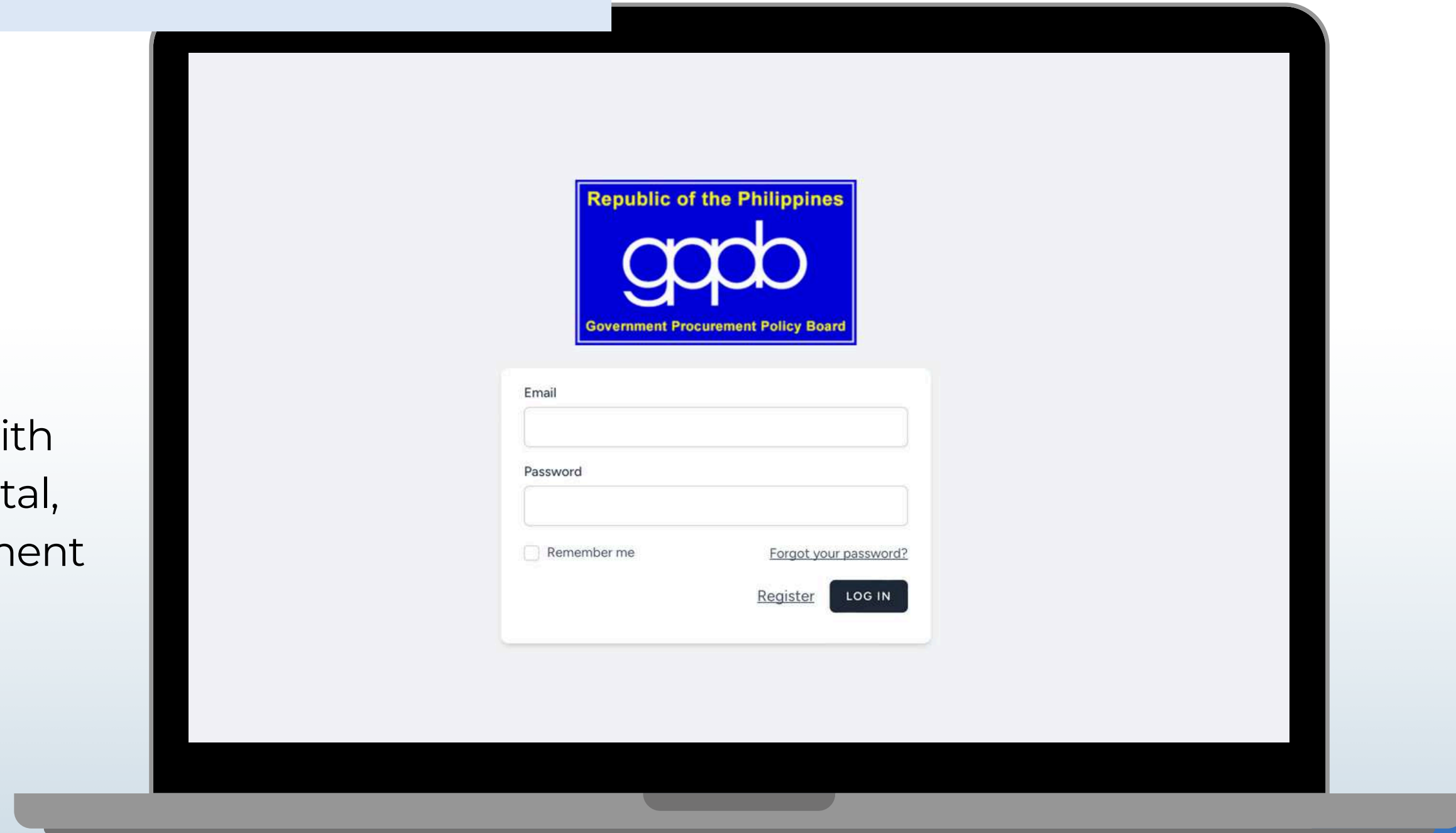

Sec. 7, RA No. 9184

xx All procurement should be within the approved budget of the Procuring Entity and should be meticulously and judiciously planned by the Procuring Entity concerned. Consistent with government fiscal discipline measures, only those considered crucial to the efficient discharge of governmental functions shall be included in the Annual Procurement Plan to be specified in the IRR. xx

xx All procurement shall be undertaken with proper and sufficient planning and preparation to ensure sound procurement decisions. This includes the conduct of relevant market scoping, supply positioning, analysis of available procurement modalities, risk management, and disposal procedures as may be applicable xx

Sec. 10, RA No. 12009

xx To ensure proper and strategic procurement planning, a Procuring Entity shall conduct market scoping as a preliminary undertaking in preparing its Project Procurement Management Plan (PPMP), which covers the **proper cost estimation, project design and specifications, technical and selection criteria, delivery lead time, storage or warehousing requirements, related industry practices, and other relevant market information** xx

RESOLUTION NO. 06-20

APPROVING THE PROPOSED GUIDELINES FOR THE PILOT IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PHILIPPINE GOVERNMENT ELECTRONIC PROCUREMENT SYSTEM ELECTRONIC MARKETPLACE

WHEREAS, Republic Act (RA) No. 12009, otherwise known as the “New Government Procurement Act,” took effect on 13 August 2024;

WHEREAS, Section 3(c) of RA No. 12009 provides that all procurement shall be governed by the principle of efficiency, among others, to be achieved through the implementation of an organized, uniform and straightforward government procurement process through the use of emerging technologies and innovative solutions;

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 91 of RA No. 12009, the Government Procurement Policy Board (GPPB) shall be the central body that sets strategic direction and makes policy decisions regarding all matters affecting public procurement, having due regard to the country’s regional and international obligations, and is tasked to lead the nation’s efforts in advancing public procurement reforms;


WHEREAS, Section 112 of RA No. 12009 states that the GPPB shall formulate the necessary Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) for the proper implementation of the Act within one hundred eighty (180) days from promulgation of the law. Accordingly, the GPPB is authorized, upon effectivity of the law, to issue the omnibus IRR and, if warranted, to develop specific rules and regulations, consistent with Section 91(a)¹ of the same law;


WHEREAS, Section 20 of RA No. 12009 provides that in order to take advantage of the significant built-in efficiencies of the Philippine Government Electronic Procurement System (PhilGEPS), Procuring Entities (PEs) shall utilize the PhilGEPS for the procurement of Common-use Supplies and Equipment (CSEs) in accordance with the rules and procedures to be established by the GPPB, in consultation with Procurement Service – Department of Budget and Management (PS-DBM). Moreover, the PhilGEPS shall include innovative features like the electronic marketplace (eMarketplace), among others;


WHEREAS, Section 40 of RA No. 12009 mandates all PEs to procure their CSEs from the PS-DBM, subject to availability; however, in cases of unavailability of stock or for purposes of efficiency, practicality, or economic viability, PEs are allowed to procure their CSEs from other sources;

WHEREAS, for reasons of efficiency and economy in bulk purchasing, the PS-DBM is authorized under Section 40 of RA No. 12009 to undertake consignment or any appropriate contractual arrangement to access goods and equipment, and may deal directly with manufacturers or exclusive distributors, subject to legal, technical and financial requirements. In this regard, the PS-DBM shall ensure that the products are to be procured from reliable sources, of the best quality and most advantageous price for the government;

PEs may procure from any other sources in case of the following instances:


- 


For unavailability of stock due to zero inventory;
- 

For reasons of efficiency, practicality and economic viability, it would be more streamlined to authorize PEs to determine the specific reason to procure the covered CSEs given that they are in the best position to determine their specific needs and requirements; and
- 

For other related reasons such as insufficient quantity, absence or failure to meet the required technical specifications, or order cancellation arising from delays
