

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 31

INSTITUTIONALIZING THE PHILIPPINE OPEN GOVERNMENT PARTNERSHIP AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, Section 16, Article XIII of the Constitution provides that the right of the people and their organizations to effective and reasonable participation at all levels of social, political, and economic decision-making shall not be abridged;

WHEREAS, in September 2011, the Philippines became one of the eight (8) founding members of the Open Government Partnership (OGP), a broad international partnership that includes members from national and local governments, and civil

WHEREAS, as a member country, the Philippines endorsed a high-level Open Government Declaration, committing itself to co-creating a National Action Plan (NAP) with the CSOs, anchored on the values of carapareency, accountability, citizen participation, and technology and innovation, and subjecting said NAP to the independent Reporting Mechanism (IRM) of the OGP:

WHEREAS, over a decade of engagement in the OGP and employing significant innovations in government processes, the Philippines is recognized as a empowering citizens; transparency, strengthening social accountability, and



The National Action Plan or NAP is OGP's policy mechanism.



How the Action Plan Model works



Action

Governments and civil society co-create two/four-year action plans with concrete reforms or commitments



Accountability

The Independent Reporting Mechanism (IRM) monitors all action plans to ensure gov'ts follow through on commitments



Community

OGP members engage in peer learning and exchange

ACTION PLAN DEVELOPMENT

Key considerations before embarking on a co-creation process, planning to plan



OUTREACH

Stakeholders are informed about the OGP, the action plan process, and how they can participate. Information can also be gathered on what they want the action plan to tackle.



Sensemaking of inputs gathered, defining problems, working on solutions, moving from problems to solutions, and drafting the commitments



FEEDBACK

Participating stakeholders will be informed of the results of their contributions to and participation in the action plan development process.




Strong Performance in Open Budget Survey

Leader in the ASEAN Region in Budget Transparency

Project DIME (Digital Information for Monitoring and Evaluation)



Utilizes existing technologies such as satellites, drones, and geotagging to compare fund utilization with actual project completion status



New Government Procurement Act

Includes a public participation mechanism, wherein observers from the private sector and civil society will be invited to participate in procurement proceedings















This law guarantees transparency through open contracting, wherein all stakeholders will have access to procurement information and observers from the private sector and civil society will be invited to participate in all levels of procurement proceedings.
